

On any given day in our community...

1,102 men, women and children are experiencing homelessness.



ON THE STREET:

165 are on the streets. *All single adults*



EMERGENCY SHELTER:

356 are in a short-term (30-90 days) shelter.

Families with children 94 beds • Single adults 262 beds



TRANSITIONAL HOUSING:

581 are in a longer-term (up to 24 months) shelter with more intensive services.

Families with children 153 beds • Single adults 94 beds

Substance abuse programs 334 beds

homelessness (n.): *The condition of living in an emergency or transitional shelter or sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation.*

Note: This definition does not include staying with family or friends, living in motel, or living in crowded or substandard conditions.



PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING:

562 are in permanent housing for families or individuals with a disability who need long-term housing that is connected to on going supportive services.
